A Romantic Myth of Caesar Rodney and a Lewes Tory Woman

Caesar Rodney is, by far, Delaware's most famous colonial era hero. For Delawareans, his hurried ride to Philadelphia in July 1776 to cast Delaware's deciding vote for independence at the Second Continental Congress is as famous

and legendary as Paul Revere's ride in Boston. The resolution before the delegates proposed that the colonies should unite in declaring freedom from Sketch of Fisher's Paradise,



British rule. Unanimous consent of the colonies was required. Delaware had three delegates: Thomas McKean, George Read, and Caesar Rodney. McKean favored the proposal. George



Read disagreed. Rodney's vote would decide Delaware's stand on the resolution.

The final vote was scheduled for July 2. But, Rodney was in Delaware on urgent business.

McKean had sent for Rodney to rush to Philadelphia to



break Delaware's stalemate. But, Rodney was delayed. At the last minute, a military escort helped send him on his way. Whether by horse or carriage, Rodney rushed to Philadelphia, arriving on the afternoon of July 2, just in time to cast his vote. A historic moment, as all thirteen

Marianne has received many continued on page 6 colonies voted unanimously to declare themselves "free and independent."

For years, the truth of Rodney's delay in Delaware was believed to be his presence in Lewes, being wooed by a lovely and beguiling, Lewes lady named Sarah Rowland. The widow Sarah was a Tory, steadfastly loyal to England. Rodney had been in Sussex County in June 1776 to deal with Tory uprisings in the area. Mrs. Rowland took advantage of the opportunity to invite Rodney to a Pilottown home, thus diverting his attention from political duties. She conveniently intercepted several of Thomas McKeon's urgent summonses, determined to keep Rodney from voting. But, on July 1, at the very last minute, Sarah's maid interrupted the companions by rushing into the room and thrusting a packet of messages into Rodney's lap. She declared:

"I'm a good Whig girl of Sussex. You are Sarah Rowland's fool!"

Shocked and alarmed, Rodney ignored Sarah's pleas of innocence. He immediately mounted his horse and dashed off to Philadelphia, 120 miles away. Leaving in the afternoon of July 1, he rode all night by horse and/or carriage, through a thunderstorm on muddy roads. He arrived exhausted and muddy at the Philadelphia State House in the afternoon of July 2, 1776 in the nick of time to declare his vote.

This is the story that Delawareans took as authentic. So much so that Katherine Pyle, sister of famed illustrator, Howard Pyle, included this account in her 1911 book, Once Upon A Time In Delaware, which was published by the Delaware Society of Colonial Dames as a schoolbook for Delaware children. The chapter "Caesar Rodney Rode for Freedom" detailed the history of the congressional meeting on independence and Caesar Rodney's famous ride to cast his vote. She dramatically describes

McKeon's despair that Rodney was so tardy. Describing how Rodney was in Sussex on urgent business to quell Tory rebellion, she states he made time for social pleasantries with the witty and wily Widow Rowland.

Miss Pyle based her facts on an 1880 poem written by Delaware-born newspaperman, author, and poet, George Alfred Townsend. Townsend wrote under the pen name "GATH" and was quite well known nationally as a war correspondent in the Civil War and as an author. He had been invited in 1880 to speak at the Fourth of July festivities in Georgetown. He wrote a lengthy, narrative poem on Caesar Rodney's ride to Philadelphia with details on the Rodney –Rowland romantic encounter. The story enthralled Delawareans and so became the "official" version. Without any proof to the contrary, the Colonial Dames who published Ms. Pyle's book placed a footnote in the book that they recognized the Sarah Rowland story as the most detailed tradition, therefore the most accurate version. But, it was NOT True! Although the book and GATH's poem contain many documented facts, the account of Rodney's dalliance in Lewes is not true. It is a proven myth.

After the 1911 publication of Katherine Pyle's book, Samuel Bancroft, Jr., owner of Wilmington newspapers and publisher of GATH's poems and novels, wrote to George Alfred Townsend, requesting his source data of the Sarah Rowland incident. Mr. Townsend replied that he wrote the poem while staying at the Burton Hotel in Rehoboth Beach in preparation of making a grand speech at the Independence Day celebration in 1880. He admitted that he concocted the controversial legend to explain the unknown reason for Rodney's absence from Congress. He had no factual evidence. But, many people continued to believe in the romantic story even

after the hoax was revealed. Lewes residents considered it "gospel" for many years. In the annals of Lewes lore, it captivated many as an exciting story.

In fact, Caesar Rodney had written his brother Thomas about being in Sussex settling uprisings, then returning to Dover to finish state matters. Thomas Rodney's diary verifies that Caesar began his July 1st journey north from his home near Dover on July 1. In the 1940s, an autograph collector found GATH's "confession" letter while rummaging through old letters and papers of Samuel Bancroft, Jr. Dr. George H. Ryden, state archivist in the 1930s was editing the Letters To and From Caesar Rodney 1756-1784 at the time of his death in 1941. He documented the letter Caesar wrote to his brother on July 4, 1776 that detailed his historic ride. The story was finally debunked!

Details on Sarah Rowland remain a mystery. One account relates names her as the daughter of the postmaster. Another refers to her as the niece of Joshua Fisher, a Lewes and Philadelphia merchant. Both of these relationships might be fact... or fiction! Finding only limited data on Rowland families, I cannot match dates for any of the several Sarah Rowlands in the Lewes area for that time period. Joshua Fisher and family were well known Tories, some even exiled to Virginia for their British loyalty. Tradition has it that the meeting of Sarah and Rodney took place at Fisher's Paradise, the home of Major Henry Fisher on Pilottown Road, Lewes. Major Fisher was a staunch patriot. A skilled pilot, he was tasked with overseeing the defense of the entrance to Delaware Bay. He provided vital $information \,to\,the\,Continental\,Congress$ on British presence in the bay. It seems highly unlikely that a Tory girl would be at the home of a patriot! I found no evidence of the family relationship between Henry Fisher and Joshua Fisher (named as Sarah's uncle). These ambiguities give weight to the myth.

Rodney's lineage is well documented. He had a distinguished record of public service to the "Three Lower Counties". From High Sheriff of Kent County to major general of the Delaware militia and finally Governor of the new Delaware State, Caesar was the consummate patriot.

Regardless of where Rodney began his famous ride into Delaware posterity, it certainly reflects on his devotion to the cause. It took heroic stamina for him to make such a grueling ride as he had been suffering from incurable, facial cancer since 1768. He died in 1784 at age 56, nine years after he saved the day for Delaware and the new nation. The myth is only an interesting aside to the





Art Museums

It has been said that art is an expression of life, so visiting an art museum is observing life in different parts of the world at different time periods. The State of Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control Proposes to Approve Sketchy Cleanup Plan for Georgetown Site

The State of Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) has proposed to approve a sketchy cleanup plan for the J.G. Townsend Site located on Pepper Street in Georgetown.

The J.G. Townsend Site in Georgetown was formerly a service station where high levels of lead in shallow soils were documented. Soil tests showed up to ten times hazardous waste levels and normally that hazardous substance at that concentration should be contained in a landfill. Over the last 10 years the plan was to dig up a few hundred cubic yards of soil for disposal but the plan changed. Now, the DNREC is poised to approve a substandard plan that doesn't involve excavation.

The problem is that contaminated soil is in contact with shallow groundwater and there is lead in that too. The DNREC's proposed to discontinue groundwater monitoring but provided a technically unsound rationale for doing so. Close to the property line they only sampled two (2) wells two (2) times and twelve (12) years apart. The results for filtered

samples showed a 100% increase in lead concentrations over 12 years but the levels were still below screening levels. Non-filtered samples were also tested and one (1) showed lead higher than screening levels; however only 2 unfiltered samples were tested but no data for comparison 12 years apart available. That testing program was unusual does not meet industry standards for groundwater monitoring programs; it is irresponsible for the DNREC to propose discontinuation of groundwater monitoring based on that data set. One conclusion which may be drawn from the available data is that since lead was detected, it indicates that it is migrating toward the property line. But further information is needed to figure out how much. It is customary to map groundwater contaminant plumes; but they skipped that. They just pulled samples at the property line and there isn't enough data to show to plot on a map to show that the remedy is protective.

Electronic Review for the Environment, Inc. reviewed the proposed cleanup plan and supporting documents and informed the DNREC that the groundwater data set that they relied upon to make their decision to close the wells at the Site was inadequate. DNREC

should recommend groundwater monitoring on a quarterly or annual schedule. That way trends in the data can be used to support decisionmaking before deciding to close the wells. The environmental group also suggested that potential contaminant transport mechanisms in the aquifer matrix should be studied. Aquifer tests are needed to determine how fast the groundwater is moving and find out what volume of groundwater is passing under the site. That way an estimate of contaminant mass that is migrating away from the contaminant source area can be made. Site conditions are favorable for a lot of groundwater flow since it is underlain by mediumgrained sand and groundwater slopes 2%. Another consideration is that a contaminant transport mechanism can be facilitated when contaminants latch onto small particles and move with the groundwater. These factors combined make it clear that DNREC should require further study, investigation and monitoring at the Site. The simplest thing would be to excavate the contaminated soil and conduct groundwater monitoring until such time that the trends in the data demonstrate that the cleanup program was effective. But if the contaminated

soil is left in place then provisions for monitoring should be kept in place.

Tom Price, Director of Electronic Review for the Environment, Inc. said: "There are a lot of technical deficiencies associated with this cleanup plan but we're hopeful that an improvement will be recommended by the department. Members of the community who would like to learn more about the project should call the Project Manager Mr. Rick Galloway of the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control at (302) 395-2614 and request a public meeting. If anyone can influence this project it is the local community."



Documentary About Escape From Nazis As Told in Needlework to be Shown at Rehoboth Beach Museum

Rehoboth Beach, DE - On April 14th at 1p.m. the Rehoboth Beach Museum will Screen a 30 minute documentary, Through the eye of the Needle. After a successful career as a dressmaker in Frederick, MD, Esther Nisenthal Krinitiz in her 60s, created a series of 36 tapestries depicting her life growing up in Poland and the years between 1942-1944 that she and her sister spent on the run from Nazi SS. The public is invited to come and enjoy the current 7th Annual Needlework Exhibit and watch the documentary to see how Esther uses needlework to tell her story.

Esther Nisenthal was 15 years old in October of 1942 when the Jews of her tiny village in Poland were ordered by the Nazis to report to a nearby train station. Anyone remaining in their home would be shot. Esther refused to go and she departs with her 13 year-old sister Mania, searching for a family friend Stefan in hopes of shelter. Unable to stay with Stefan, Esther invents new identities for herself and Mania — now Polish Catholic farm girls—as they hide in plain sight from the Nazis.

Esther's story of survival is depicted in a series of 36 large fabric collages, embroidered in vivid color created more than 40 years after the war. These extraordinary tapestries portray one young girl's eyewitness account. Through Esther's own words and images of her artwork, as well as interviews with her

daughters and others, the award-winning 30-minute film "Through the Eye of the Needle" explores the capacity of the human heart to heal.

INVESTING 101 By Nicholas Shevland

How does infrastructure spending boost economic growth?

I've read quite a bit about the benefits of infrastructure spending and I've heard plenty of people exclaim about how fixing our roads, bridges, and airports will solve, fix, or boost economic growth in the United States. What I don't hear is exactly how this might happen. So, let me explain.

First, let's understand exactly what infrastructure is. It's the physical systems of a particular area that improve the standard of living. Some examples are bridges, roads, airports, sewer systems, and much more.

These structures provide economic benefits because they allow businesses more opportunities to sell their particular products or services. For example, a plumber in Rehoboth Beach can offer his services to citizens in Georgetown, DE because of the roads and bridges that allow him to safely and efficiently travel the 30 minute commute.

If there were roads and bridges set up that allow that same plumber to drive to Wilmington, DE in

30 minutes (currently, it takes 1hr 45 mins, without traffic, according to Google Maps), that would only increase the opportunity for that plumber to grow his/her business. That kind of infrastructure spending has the ability to increase economic growth assuming the cost of the project is less than the benefit.

That assumption is what I don't hear a lot about. If fixing a bridge between Rehoboth and Georgetown costs \$10 million dollars, will it create more than \$10 million dollars in benefits? I would argue that fixing a particular infrastructure back to its original status does not increase economic growth. It merely maintains an economic level at a cost, not a benefit.

I bring this up because, recently, The American Society of Civil Engineer's Report Card came out with a D+ grade for The United States Infrastructure. Plans are in motion to improve on America's grade and dozens of reports are coming out about an increase in infrastructure spending. Will this increase in spending be an economic benefit?

Only if the costs are less than the benefit!
