Army & Air Force Radar Surveillance Site at Bear Trap Dunes

Engineers constructed the facility, which became operational by February 1942, a short time after war was declared in December 1941. This site and 25 other sites along the Atlantic coast from Maine to Virginia were soon converted to permanent radar installations. The permanent equipment (SCR-271) was an upgrade with greater long-range surveillance capacity to detect enemy aircraft. This site was designated as Radar Site 11. By June 1942, this manned station included 14 concrete block buildings that included barracks for soldiers, guard posts, kitchen, mess hall, recreation hall, lavatories, radar building, administration offices, and a pump house.

Army Radar Site 11 was closed in 1944 as enemy threats lessened. The barracks were used to house German POWS after the war. The location was deemed surplus property and sold. Radar equipment was removed and the buildings were left to deteriorate.


As the Cold War developed, improved radar technology was available for the Air Defense System. The US Air Force assumed the responsibility of defending the skies against enemy missile strikes. The SAGE (semi-automatic ground environment) provided an electronic radar upgrade with a large-scale computer to transmit information in order to provide enemy interception control. Bendix Radio built the equipment, which modified earlier air defense radar components to produce the AN/FPS-14, a medium range radar to fill in the low-altitude gaps in coverage between the long-range units. These gaps were susceptible to enemy aircraft flying low enough to avoid detection by the longer-range radar. Gaps in coverage between the long-range radar units were caused by curvature of earth and other topographical features.. The computer automatically transmitted data by

She is now exploring her writing skills with local history articles for *High Tide News*. telephone lines to USAF Cape Charles, VA station, which monitored positions of jet bomber airplanes and defense missile weapons.

A typical unmanned gap filler radar station consisted of an L-shaped, cinderblock building with radar equipment and the computer equipment in one section and diesel generators that powered the unit in the other section. A typical radar tower was a three-legged 85 ft.



tower. Most sites used the AN/FPS-14 (Army Navy/Fixed Radar Search) radar with a range of 65-90 miles.

In July 1956, the US Department of Defense sought to take over three tracts of land in Ocean View, Baltimore Hundred, Sussex County, totaling 5.07 acres owned by Raymond L. and Ezekiel E. Banks. The site was officially called the Bethany Beach Gap Filler Site and operated by the Air Force. This site differed from WWII Army Radar Site 11 in that there was no armed guard protection nor personnel stationed there.

I spoke with Larry Whitten of Millsboro, who was assigned to provide maintenance on the radar equipment at this Bethany Gap Filler Site, designated as P-56B, in 1958. As an airman, based out of Cape Charles, VA, he worked at this station from 1958-1960 and from 1967-1968, when the site was decommissioned. He related that this Air Force radar site was surrounded by electrified barbed wire fencing and radiation danger warning signs. The concrete building used for the computer equipment was approximately 35-40 ft. square. An attached 15x20 ft. room housed the diesel engine. The tall screen radar antenna sat out in the open and moved continuously in a circle, automatically providing aircraft warning data via computer telephone line to Cape Charles. If unidentified aircraft was spotted by the radar, the Cape Charles station notified a nearby Air Defense Base for jet interceptor deployment. Larry mentioned that he and 5-6 other servicemen provided weekly maintenance on a rotating basis with other installations at Mappsville, VA, and Elizabeth, NC.

In the 1960s, as Cold War threats lessened, the property was once again

cleared of military radar equipment. The land was conveyed to Raymond L. Banks, Jr. by Quitclaim Deed, dated 4 November 1970. Ownership passed to his sons, Russell V. and David L. Banks, in 1976. The location became overgrown. In November 1988, the Defense Environmental Restoration Program conducted an inspection of the property to determine its condition. They found no hazardous debris or unexploded ordnance on the site. The owner wished to leave it unimproved.

Once the property was sold in 1999 to Carl M. Freeman Communities for development, the company partnered with the Delaware Historic Preservation Office and DNREC to document the historic site and remove the damaged buildings.

In 2004, the Delaware Archives erected a historic marker to mark the location of the Army Radar Site 11. The Freeman Communities also marked the site with a walkway and signs in order to recognize and preserve the military history of this property.

All that remains of the radar installation sites today is a concrete pump house. Larry Whitten related that his crew at the Gap Filler Site called this building the POL shed, storage for paints, oils, and lubricants during 1957-1968. The site eventually became overgrown and the buildings damaged. Today, this pump house is all that remains of this military site to symbolize the role our community played in our country's defense.

Visit the site located off Magnolia Street in Bear Trap Dunes, just off Beaver Dam Road. The wooden walkway leads to the pump house site.

** RADAR is an acronym for "Radio Detection and Ranging".

My Favorite Airports

When you spend as much time traveling as I do, airports become your home. In bad airports, that can mean long, boring experiences. In good airports, that can mean exciting, interesting experiences. I'd like to share with you my experiences, in the event that you get to visit these international airports. In order of my preference of the best international airports:

Singapore Changi: This is by far the most elegant airport with the most amenities. It is has been written about in many newspapers and magazines. Singapore is so far away from everywhere, and Changi Airport is designed for comfort after long trips. There you can find an elegant swimming pool and many gardens showing off cacti, sunflowers, orchids and water lilies. You can find a Koi fish pond, shopping galleria, movie theater and many other amenities. Singapore is so small, that you could also leave the airport during a long connection and go to a beach resort at Sentosa Island, then come back for your connection. Yes, I have done this! Everything in the airport is immaculate and attractive.

Note: I have never been to the Dubai Airport, but people tell me it is also amazing!

Tokyo Narita: This airport, like most of Japan, is well run and clean, especially the toilets. It has elegant shopping, and it is relatively easy to get around with good signage. The airport lounges have fantastic complimentary food and alcoholic beverages. It is far from downtown Tokyo, but the Limousine Bus and Narita-Express Train systems are extremely easy to take and run regularly.

Beijing/Shanghai-Pudong: Both of these are world class airports. I used the Beijing airport in 1990, when I made my first trip to China. The airport road was horrible and the airport itself was that of an underdeveloped country. In twenty years, these airports, as well as the highways to get to them, have transformed to beautiful, well-run ports of entry. The main reason for this was the 2008 Beijing Olympics, for which the main airport underwent a tremendous facelift. The lounges are second to none, and it is very easy to find your way around.

Detroit: This airport gets special mention, because of the cleanliness, efficiency and amount of restaurants, bars and shopping. It is well laid with good transportation from gate to gate.

Frankfurt: This airport reminds me a lot of Tokyo Narita, Beijing and Shanghai in that it is extremely well run. The Germans are very efficient and the schedules run like clockwork. The airport is super clean with easy access to good food and places to rest. Being such a large airport, it is not uncommon to have to walk a very long way to a connecting next gate. It is also only minutes from Downtown Frankfurt, a very vibrant city.

Newark Liberty/Houston George Bush: These are two main hubs for United airlines, where I spend a significant amount of time. There is an abundance to eat and shop in both airports. One of my favorite airport restaurants in Houston Bush is Pappadeaux Seafood Kitchen, where the Texas Cajun food makes for a worthwhile flight transfer. The Houston Bush United Clubs are spacious, if you are fortunate enough to be a member, and the terminal transfers are easily done with a train system. Moving between terminals in Newark is a little more complicated with a bus system, whose location is not always so obvious. Newark's Terminal C is by a long shot the more elegant and desirable terminal.

Wellington, New Zealand: This is the

home of Peter Jackson, who wrote, directed and produced Lord of the Rings. To honor his work, this airport is filled with huge statues and models of the characters of the story, hanging from ceilings and on pedestals for your entertainment pleasure. You can also get local foods, like a marmite (a spread on bread) and chip sandwich.

Tocumen Airport, Panama City, Panama: COPA is the Panamanian airline, which is part of the Star Alliance with United. Since I always try to fly United Airlines or one of its Star Alliance partners, I use COPA when I travel down to Latin America. COPA flights use Panama City as a hub, and, while Tocumen is a small airport, the quality of shops and restaurants is surprisingly impressive. The transfers are easy, and COPA will upgrade Star Alliance frequent fliers, even if the flight is a very long international one, like to Brazil.

I also have my list of the worst airports I have experienced:

Mumbai, India, Chhatrapati Shivaji: This had to be the most chaotic and unclean international airport I have experienced. Everything from the seats at the gate to the restaurants was no frills. Everywhere was crowded, and I just could not wait to get on the plane and get out.

London Heathrow: This airport has been under construction for years and always has dirty passageways with construction walls behind which someone is building something. After years of using this airport, I have given up on seeing the results.

Chicago O'Hare: One of the busiest U.S. airports, it is old and crowded with narrow hallways, mostly in Terminals E and F.

Washington Dulles: This airport is blah and boring, and far out of the way from Washington DC. If you go, you will find it Author, **Vincent Paez** is a chemist and international businessman. difficult to navigate in, especially if your gate is in Terminal Z, which requires you to go up and around levels and around corners – very challenging. I also do not like to arrive and board a shuttle bus to go from the airplane to the gate, and this is very common in Dulles.

Santiago, Chile and Guarulhos/Sao Paolo, Brazil: These two airports force only Americans to pay an extra visa fee at the airport. They call it a fee of reciprocation, because Chileans and Brazilians get charged a similar fee when they arrive in the U.S.A. I call it a pain. It is possible that Brazil no longer do this.

In the U.S.A., it is clear which airports are new, fresh and clean, like Detroit and Denver. It is also clear which airports are old and tired, like Atlanta, Chicago O'Hare, and Washington Dulles. Apparently, it costs a lot to revamp an airport, and many cities will not do this. Let the cities know, that, when you travel as much as I do, you plan your routing through the more pleasant and renovated airports. I will transfer in Tokyo/Narita or Houston any day. I will try to not transfer in Mumbai. And if I ever have the chance to experience Dubai, I will look forward to it! INVESTING 101

Election Cycles Mean More Than Just Choosing a President

When people think about cycles in the stock market, they tend to look at the obvious drivers of stock prices: major forces such as the state of the economy, the level of corporate profits, and conditions in global markets. But did you know that a presidential election itself can be a key pivot point in stock price trends?

Consider the average yearly performance of the stock market in the table below. After accounting for random volatility, average presidential election year performance was slightly below overall average performance.

But look at the other years in the election cycle. The first two years of presidential terms have, on average, lagged significantly. But then, in the third year, the market made up the lost ground and more.

What's Going On?

Election years tend to have a degree of uncertainty over the future direction of the country, and the market may translate that uncertainly into some reluctance to commit on the part of investors. Then, after the direction is set, it may take some time for policy changes to assert any influence, further depressing investment demand. By the third year, clarity could return and investors could embrace the future.

Exceptions May Be More Powerful Than the Generalities

Keep in mind that the amount of variation in annual returns is substantial, and is reflected in the high variability, measured by standard deviation. As a consequence, the chances are good that performance in any given year could end up being far different from the average for its category.

That becomes clear when looking at the extremely good and extremely bad performing years in the S&P 500 performance data set. The four best years were 1928 (44%), 1933 (53%), 1935 (60%), and 1954 (52%). The four worst years were 1931

(-41%), 1937 (-34%), 1974 (-26%), and 2008 (-37%).¹

No two of the extreme up years occurred at the same point in an election cycle, neither did any two of the extreme down years. Three of the extreme years are associated with Democratic incumbents and five with Republican incumbents.

Ultimately, six of the eight extreme performance years were associated with unpredictable macroeconomic tidal waves – the Great Depression, the oil price shock (when energy prices quadrupled in a few months), and the recent financial crisis – events much bigger than any election news. So if you are thinking of cashing in on an election year rally – or selling before an election year rout – think again. As history has shown, trying to time the market – for whatever reason – is often a loser's game.
